THE ELEMENTARY EDUCATION LAWS, 1933 TO 1937.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 5.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 5 of the Elementary Education Laws, 1933 to 1937, His Excellency the Governor is pleased to make and hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Elementary Education (Classification and Promotion of Teachers) Regulations, 1937.

2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“Law” means the Elementary Education Laws, 1933 to 1937, and includes any regulations made thereunder and relating to the qualifications of teachers.

“Register” means the Permanent Staff Register required to be kept by the Director of Education under the provisions of section 32 of the Law.

3. Teachers shall be classified by the Director of Education into four classes, namely, first, second, third and fourth.

4. The Register shall comprise the four classes of teachers in regulation 2 hereof mentioned, and the name and surname of each teacher in each class shall be recorded by the Director of Education or by his direction in the appropriate class in the Register.

5. Teachers shall be promoted by the Director of Education from one class to another according to the number of vacancies in each class and according to the requirements of the service.

6. No person shall be registered as a teacher on the Register and no teacher on the Register shall be promoted to the third or any higher class unless such person or teacher, in addition to possessing any other qualifications which may be required by the Law, has passed the Ordinary Examination in English or another examination considered by the Director of Education to be the equivalent thereof.

7. From and after the 1st day of September, 1938,—

- (a) no person shall be registered as a teacher on the Register, and
- (b) no teacher registered in the fourth class shall be promoted to the third or any higher class,

unless such person or teacher, in addition to possessing all other qualifications which may be required by the Law, has passed the Distinction Examination in English or another examination considered by the Director of Education to be equivalent thereof.

8. In considering candidates for registration or promotion as in regulation 7 hereof prescribed before the 1st day of September, 1938, the Director of Education shall give preference as between two or more candidates otherwise in his opinion equally qualified to those candidates who have passed the Distinction Examination in English or another examination considered by the Director of Education to be the equivalent thereof.

9. The Regulations for the Classification and Promotion of Teachers, dated the 5th March, 1932, and published under Notification No. 203 in the *Gazette* of the 11th March, 1932, and the Elementary Education (Qualifications of School Teachers) Regulations, 1935, are hereby revoked.
