THE LAND ACQUISITION LAWS, 1899 TO 1936.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 4.

Whereas it has been represented to me that it is desirable in the public interest to improve the Limassol Port and the sea front at Limassol, in the District of Limassol :

Now, therefore, I, Andrew Barkworth Wright, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, on whom has been conferred the Decoration of the Military Cross, Acting Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus, by virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 2, 3 and 4 of the Land Acquisition Laws, 1899 to 1936, do hereby declare the acquisition of land and buildings in the town of Limassol for the improvement of the Limassol Port and the sea front at Limassol to be an undertaking of public utility, and do hereby authorize the carrying out of the said undertaking and do hereby entrust to the Director of Public Works the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking.

The Quarantine Law, 1932.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 4.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 4 of the Quarantine Law, 1932, or otherwise, His Excellency the Acting Governor is pleased to declare and it is hereby declared that the local areas in the first column of the Schedule hereto are infected local areas and that all passengers and goods therefrom shall, as from the date hereof, be subject to the measures prescribed by the Quarantine Regulations, 1932 to 1936, with respect to the dangerous infectious diseases in the second column of the Schedule hereto.

The Notification No. 108, published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 17 June, 1938, is hereby cancelled.
