THE DANGEROUS DRUGS LAWS, 1925 TO 1932.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1770

MADE UNDER SECTION 11 (2).

Whereas by section 11 (2) of the Dangerous Drugs Laws, 1925 to 1932, power is conferred on His Excellency the Governor by Order in Council to declare that Part III of the said Laws shall apply to any drug of whatever kind in the same manner as it applies to the drugs mentioned in sub-section (1) of the said section 11 if it appears to him that the drug is or is likely to be productive, if improperly used, or is capable of being converted into a substance which is or is likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analogous to those produced by Indian hemp, morphine or cocaine :

And whereas it appears to His Excellency the Governor that all preparations, admixtures or other substances (except syrupus Codeinae Phosphatis B.P.C. 1934) containing any proportion of methylmorphine (commonly known as codeine) or ethylmorphine (commonly known as dionin) associated with an inert substance whether solid or liquid and all preparations, admixtures or other substances containing more than 2.5 per cent. of methylmorphine or ethylmorphine (calculated as pure

drug) associated with another medicinal substance are productive, if improperly used, or are capable of being converted into a substance which is, or is likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analogous to those produced by Indian hemp, morphine or cocaine :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by section 11 (2) of the Dangerous Drugs Laws, 1925 to 1932, and with the advice of the Executive Council, is pleased to order and declare and it is hereby ordered and declared that Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Laws, 1925 to 1932, shall apply to any preparation, admixture or other substance (except syrupus Codeinae Phosphatis B.P.C. 1934) containing any proportion of methylmorphine (commonly known as codeine) or ethylmorphine (commonly known as dionin) associated with any inert substance whether solid or liquid, and to any preparation, admixture or other substance containing more than 2.5 per cent. of methylmorphine or ethylmorphine (calculated as pure drug) associated with any other medicinal substance in the same manner as the said Part III applies to the drugs mentioned in section 11 (1) of the Dangerous Drugs Laws, 1925 to 1932.

2. The Order in Council No. 1595 published in the *Gazette* of the 10th August, 1934, under Notification No. 823, is hereby revoked without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.

3. This Order shall be deemed to have taken effect as from the 1st day of May, 1937.
