THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO 1938.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1799

MADE UNDER SECTION 52.

In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1938, His Excellency the Acting Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Flax Yarn) Exemption Order, 1938.
- 2. Flax yarn imported into the Colony from any part of the British Empire, between the 23rd day of July, 1938, and the 22nd day of July, 1939, both inclusive, by any owner of a factory for the weaving of cloth therefrom, shall be admitted into the Colony free from all import duties.

THE BURIALS LAWS, 1896 AND 1937.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 1 of the Burials Laws, 1896 and 1937, His Excellency the Acting Governor has been pleased to order and hereby orders that a burial-ground shall be provided for the said village for the purpose aforesaid under the provisions of the said Laws.
