THE DEPORTATION (BRITISH SUBJECTS) LAW, 1936.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 18.

H. R. PALMER,  
*Governor.*

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 18 of the Deportation (British Subjects) Law, 1936, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, is pleased to make and hereby makes the following regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Deportation (British Subjects) Regulations, 1938.
2. In these Regulations—  
the expression “ the Law ” means the Deportation (British Subjects) Law, 1936.
3. Every deportation order made under the provisions of section 3 of the Law shall be in the Form A set out in the Schedule hereto.
4. Every notice required to be served under the provisions of section 5 of the Law upon a person charged under the Law shall be in the Form B set out in the Schedule hereto.
5. Every detention direction made under the provisions of section 9 (2) of the Law shall be in the Form C set out in the Schedule hereto.

(Regulation 3.)
