In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 34 of the Newspaper, Books and Printing Presses Laws, 1934 to 1936, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Newspaper ("Tachydromos Omonia") Prohibition Order, 1938.

2. The introduction or circulation in the Colony of the Newspaper set out in the Schedule hereto is prohibited.

No. 235.**THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO 1938.****ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1822**

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1938, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Olive Stones) Reduction Order, 1938.

2. Olive stones imported into the Colony between the 25th day of November, 1938, and the 31st day of August, 1939, both days inclusive, shall be admitted into the Colony upon payment of import duty at the reduced rate of two shillings per ton, in lieu of the *ad valorem* rate of twenty-four per centum prescribed in the First Schedule to the said Laws.
