

17.—(1) Upon an application to the Commissioner signed by not less than two-thirds of the proprietors mentioned in the list requesting that the Irrigation Division be dissolved, the Commissioner shall call a meeting of the proprietors for the purpose of determining whether the Irrigation Division should be dissolved.

(2) Every meeting so convened shall be held in the presence of the Commissioner at the time and place appointed and if at such meeting a majority of two-thirds of the proprietors or the authorized proxies thereof who are present decide that the Irrigation Division should be dissolved, the Irrigation Division shall be so dissolved accordingly :

Provided that all rates due and unpaid on the date of dissolution shall be levied and paid as if the Irrigation Division had not been dissolved.

(3) The provisions of sections 4, 6, 7, 8 and 9 of the Law with respect to public meetings shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to a meeting convened under the provisions of this rule.

(4) Any money in the hands of the Committee or the treasurer at the time of the dissolution of the Irrigation Division and any money recovered at any time thereafter on account of the rates due and unpaid at the time of such dissolution, shall be paid to the Commissioner and shall be passed in the books of the Commissioner to the credit of the village of Maroni and shall be utilized by the Commissioner for such purpose of public utility in the village of Maroni as may be approved by him.

**No. 239. The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Law, 1880.**

ORDER UNDER SECTION 2 (1) (l.)

In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 2 (1) (l.) of the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Law, 1880, duly deputed to me under section 4 of the said Law by paragraph 3 of the Notification No. 527 published in the *Gazette* of the 3rd July, 1931, I, Robert Jestin Roe, Chief Veterinary Officer, hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Ox Warble-Fly Control Order, 1938.
2. All cattle in the Colony shall be treated for the destruction of warble-fly larvae not less than once in each month between 1st December, 1938, and 30th April, 1939.
3. The treatment shall be carried out free of charge by Veterinary Officers or by such Dressers as may be appointed by me in writing in that behalf.
4. Every owner or person in charge of cattle shall produce such cattle for treatment at such places and at such times as shall be appointed by a Veterinary Officer or Dresser as aforesaid by notice posted in a conspicuous place in the village concerned, and every such owner or person in charge shall render full assistance to the Veterinary Officer or Dresser in the treatment of the cattle as aforesaid.
