**THE MISSIONARY EDUCATIONAL AND MEDICAL (ALIEN
REGULATION) LAWS, 1922 AND 1933.**

ORDER IN COUNCIL.—No. 1831

MADE UNDER SECTION 7.

Whereas in pursuance of the provisions of the Missionary Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Laws, 1922 and 1933, the person whose name appears in the Schedule hereto has applied for a permit under the provisions of the said Laws :

And whereas the said person has given an undertaking in writing to pay due obedience and respect to the Government of Cyprus, and while carefully abstaining from participation in political affairs, that she desires and purposes *ex animo* to work in friendly co-operation with the said Government in all matters in which her influence might properly be exerted ; and, in particular, she has undertaken that if engaged in educational work, her influence will be exerted to promote loyalty to the Government of Cyprus in the minds of her pupils, and to make them good citizens of the British Empire :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by the said Laws and otherwise, and with the advice of the Executive Council, His Excellency the Governor is pleased to grant to the person whose name appears in the Schedule hereto a permit to commence or to carry on the work set down after her name.
