THE PRISON DISCIPLINE LAW, 1879.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 4.

H. R. PALMER,

Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 4 of the Prison Discipline Law, 1879, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make and hereby makes the following Regulations:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Prison (Amendment) Regulations, 1938, and shall be read as one with the Prison Regulations, 1908 to 1937, (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations"), and the Principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Prison Regulations, 1908 to 1938.
- 2. Schedule C to the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of that part which relates to Dietary for Military Prisoners and the substitution therefor of the following:—

DIETARY FOR MILITARY PRISONERS.

Breakfast:

Bread, 8 ounces. Butter or margarine, $\frac{1}{2}$ ounce. Sugar, 1 ounce Cocoa, 1 ounce Milk, 1/16 pint.

$oldsymbol{Dinner}$:

Beef or salt pork, 8 ounces, without bone. Macaroni or rice, 2 ounces, or peas, 4 ounces. Vegetables, 4 ounces. Pepper and salt, to season. Potatoes, 6 ounces. Rice, ½ ounce.

Milk, 6/16 pint.

Supper:

Bread, 8 ounces.
Butter or Margarine, 1 ounce.
Sugar, 1 ounce.
Tea, ½ ounce or less.
Milk, 1/16 pint.

Provided that the Medical Officer may recommend any increase or change of food in the dietary for Military Prisoners which he may deem necessary.
