THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO 1938.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1832

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1938, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Iron and Steel Scrap) Exemption Order, 1938.
2. From and after the 1st January, 1939, all iron and steel scrap imported into the Colony shall be admitted into the Colony free from all import duties.
