THE SUMMER AFTERNOON RECESS LAW, 1938.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1863

MADE UNDER SECTION 3.

In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 3 of the Summer Asternoon Recess Law, 1938, His Excellency the Acting Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Summer Afternoon Recess Order, 1939.
- 2. Between the 1st day of June, 1939, and the 30th day of September, 1939, both days inclusive, all places of business within the municipal limits of the towns of Nicosia, Limassol, Larnaca, Famagusta (including Varosha), Paphos and Kyrenia, and of the villages of Lefka, Lefkara, Lefkoniko, Morphou, Kythrea and Polis, shall be closed and kept closed every day of the week between the hours of 12.30 p.m. to 2.30 p.m.:

Provided that there shall be exempted from the operation of this Order the following places of business:—

- (a) Telegraph and Telephone Offices.
- (b) Electric Power Stations.
- (c) Clubs.
- (d) Hotels, inns, khans, restaurants, cookshops and cafés.
- (e) Premises occupied by medical practitioners, dentists or advocates in connection with the exercise of their work or profession.
- (f) Chemists and druggists shops or stores.
- (g) Offices of shipping and travelling agencies.
- (h) Offices of agencies for the hire of motor cars.
- (i) Ice factories.
- (i) Public baths.
- (k) Aerodromes.
- (l) Undertaker's premises.
