Whereas the four burial-grounds situated in the village of Yialia, District of Paphos, now in use by the Moslem Community for the burial of the dead, are dangerous to the health of the said village :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 1 of the Burials Laws, 1896 and 1937, His Excellency the Acting Governor has been pleased to order and hereby orders that a new burial-ground, in substitution for the burial-grounds now in use as aforesaid, shall be provided under the provisions of the said Laws.

## No. 156. THE IMMIGRATION LAWS, 1936 TO 1939.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 31.

A. B. WRIGHT,

Acting Governor.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Governor by section 31 of the Immigration Laws, 1936 to 1939, His Excellency the Acting Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, is pleased to make and hereby makes the following regulations :---

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Immigration (Registration of Aliens) (No 2) Regulations, 1939, and shall be read as one with the Immigration (Registration of Aliens) Regulations, 1939, (hereinafter called "the Principal Regulations"), and the Principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Immigration (Registration of Aliens) Regulations, 1939 and (No. 2) 1939.

2. Regulation 2 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the deletion of the definition of "native of the Colony" contained therein and by the substitution therefor of the following definition :—

"The expression 'native of the Colony' means any person who is a British subject and—

(a) was born in the Colony or of parents who at the time of his birth were ordinarily resident in the Colony; or

(b) obtained the status of a British subject by virtue of the Cyprus (Annexation) Orders in Council, 1914 to 1929, or by reason of the grant by the Governor of a certificate of Naturalization under the British Nationality and Statutes of Aliens Act, 1914; or

(c) is the wife of a person to whom any of the foregoing paragraphs applies not living apart from such person under a decree of a competent Court or of a deed of separation; or

(d) is a child, step-child or adopted child having been adopted in manner recognized by law, under the age of eighteen years,

of a person to whom any of the foregoing paragraphs applies";
