No. 169. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO (No. 2) 1938.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1872

MADE UNDER SECTION 52.

In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 2) 1938, His Excellency the Acting Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order and hereby orders as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Municipal Town Clocks and Cesspool Emptiers) Exemption Order, 1939.

2. From and after the 1st day of August, 1939, town clocks or cesspool emptiers imported into the Colony by any Municipal Corporation certified by the Mayor of such Corporation that they shall be used solely for public municipal purposes, provided that they are of British Empire origin, shall be admitted into the Colony free from all import duties.

No. 170. THE BURIALS LAWS, 1896 AND 1937.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 14.

Whereas in pursuance of Notification No. 205 published in Supplement No. 3 to *Gazette* No. 2619 of the 19th November, 1937, a fit and proper site has been registered in the books of the Land Registry Office as a burial-ground for the burial of the dead by the Orthodox-Christian Community of the village of Chakistra, in the District of Nicosia :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 14 of the Burials Laws, 1896 and 1937, His Excellency the Acting Governor has been pleased to order and hereby orders that, from and after the 15th day of August, 1939, no burial shall take place in the burial-ground in lieu whereof the new burial-ground above referred to has been provided.
