**No. 178. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO (No. 2) 1938.**

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1873

MADE UNDER SECTION 52.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 2) 1938, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Flax Yarn) Exemption Order, 1939.

2. Flax yarn imported into the Colony from any part of the British Empire, between the 23rd day of July, 1939, and the 22nd day of July, 1940, both inclusive, by any owner of a factory for the weaving of cloth therefrom, shall be admitted into the Colony free from all import duties.
