THE BANK HOLIDAYS LAW, 1928.

PROCLAMATION MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL  
UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 6 of the Bank Holidays Law, 1928, and with the advice of the Executive Council, I, William Denis Battershill, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus, do hereby proclaim that the following days, that is to say, Saturday the second day of September, Monday the fourth day of September, and Tuesday the fifth day of September, 1939, are hereby appointed to be and shall be observed as bank holidays for the purposes of the said Law.

Given at Troödos, this 1st day of September, 1939.
