THE CYPRUS CURRENCY NOTES ORDER AND LAW,
1928 AND 1935.

RULES MADE UNDER ARTICLE XV.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by Article XV of the Cyprus Currency Notes Order and Law, 1928 and 1935, His Excellency the Governor, with the approval of the Secretary of State, is pleased to make and hereby makes the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as the Cyprus Currency Notes (Amendment) Rules, 1939, and shall be read as one with the Cyprus Currency Notes Rules, 1930, (hereinafter called "the Principal Rules") and the Principal Rules and these Rules may together be cited as the Cyprus Currency Notes Rules, 1930 and 1939.

2. Rule 9 of the Principal Rules is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) By the deletion of paragraph (1) thereof and the substitution therefor of the following paragraph:—

"(1) The denominations and sizes of currency notes which may be issued under the Order shall be as follows:—

<i>Denomination.</i>	<i>Size.</i>
£5	5½ inches by 3½ inches.
£1	do. do.
10s.	5½ inches by 3 inches.
5s.	4 15/16 inches by 2 14/16 inches.
2s.	4 13/16 inches by 2 11/16 inches.
1s.	4 10/16 inches by 2 9/16 inches."

(b) By the insertion in paragraph 2 (f) thereof after the figure "10s." of the figures "5s., 2s. and 1s."

(c) By the insertion in paragraph (3) thereof, after the words "Government of Cyprus", of the words "except in 5s., 2s. and 1s. currency notes which shall bear a design consisting of pictorial and decorative elements together with the words 'Government of Cyprus'."

3. These Rules shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1939.
