

8. No person shall sell by retail to any purchaser of lentils more than one week's supply during any one week.

9. For the purposes of this Order, the term "by wholesale" means—

(a) any sale or purchase of, or

(b) any offer for sale of, or

(c) any attempt to sell or purchase, or

(d) any arrangement made, either directly or indirectly, for the sale or purchase of,
any lentils in quantities in excess of 20 okes at any one time or at any single transaction.

10. Any person who—

(a) acts in contravention of the provisions of clause 2 or 3 or 5 or 6 or 7 or 8 of this Order, or

(b) makes a false declaration under clause 5 of this Order,

shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in Regulation 63 (1) of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (CYPRUS DEFENCE)
REGULATIONS, 1939.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 43.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the purposes of Regulation 43 of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939, I hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Regulation of Sale Prices) (Certain Imported Articles) Order, 1939.

2.—(1) No person shall—

(a) sell or purchase, or

(b) offer for sale or attempt to sell or purchase, or

(c) either directly or indirectly make any arrangement for the sale or purchase of,

any of the articles (being articles imported into the Colony) described in the first column of the Schedule hereto in any town or village in the Colony at a price which would give the vendor—

(i) where such vendor is a person who has imported such article into the Colony, a profit in excess of the percentage of profit shown against the description of each such article in the second column of the said Schedule, and

(ii) where such vendor has purchased such article locally from an importer thereof for the purpose of resale, a profit in excess of the percentage of profit shown against the description of each such article in the third column of the said Schedule,

such percentage of profit to be calculated on the total value of such article.

(2) For the purposes of this clause, the term "total value" means—

(a) in the case of a person who has imported such article into the Colony, the price of the article shown in the invoice relating to the article when imported into the Colony and the amount of the import duties, wharfage dues and any other due or charge (if any) paid by such person in relation to any such article at the time of taking delivery of the article for home consumption; and

(b) in the case of a person who has purchased such article locally from an importer thereof for the purpose of resale, the price at which he purchased the article from the importer thereof: Provided that such price shall not be higher than the purchase price prevailing for such article in the market on or prior to the 26th day of August, 1939.

3. The Commissioner of each District shall, if so required by me, appoint Inspectors to enquire—

(a) into the stocks of any of the articles described in the first column of the Schedule hereto which are in the possession or under the control of any person or generally of all persons residing in any town or village within his District; and

(b) into the total value of any of the said articles as defined in clause 2 (2) of this Order.

4. Any person when so required to do by an Inspector appointed under clause 3 of this Order shall make a declaration—

(a) of the stock of any of the articles described in the first column of the Schedule hereto in his possession or under his control, and

(b) of the total value of such article as defined in regulation 2 (2) of this Order,

and any such Inspector may enter upon any premises for the purpose of carrying out any inspection or search reasonably required in order to obtain the necessary information concerning the amount or condition of the stock of any such article and of the total value thereof.

5. Where any person who sells or exposes for sale or holds stocks of any of the articles described in the first column of the Schedule hereto refuses, on demand being made to him by a prospective purchaser, to sell to him any such article, and such refusal is in my opinion, or in the opinion of the Commissioner of the District, unreasonable, such person shall at my request, or at the request of such Commissioner, deliver such article to me or to him to be sold at a price in accordance with the provisions of clause 2 of this Order, or to be disposed of in such manner as I, or the said Commissioner, may in that behalf direct.

6. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to or affect any article (being an article imported into the Colony) in respect of which a specific order has been made by me under Regulation 43 of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939.

7. Any person who—

(a) acts in contravention of the provisions of clause 2 or 4 or 5 of this Order, or

(b) makes a false declaration under clause 4 of this Order,

shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in Regulation 63 (1) of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939, and proceedings may be taken against such person under the provisions of Regulation 63 of the said Regulations. If in any such proceedings any question arises as to the total value of any article, the subject matter of the charge, as defined in clause 2 (2) of this Order, the onus of proving such total value shall lie upon the person charged.

**THE EMERGENCY POWERS (CYPRUS DEFENCE)
REGULATIONS, 1939.**

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 43.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of Regulation 43 of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939, I hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Regulation of Sale Prices) (Wheat) Amendment Order, 1939, and shall be read as one with the Defence (Regulation of Sale Prices) (Wheat) Order, 1939, (hereinafter called "the Principal Order"), and the Principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Defence (Regulation of Sale Prices) (Wheat) Orders, 1939.

2. The Schedule to the Principal Order is hereby repealed and the following Schedule substituted therefor :—
