

3. For the purposes of this Order, the term "petroleum product" means any inflammable liquid or substance derived from petroleum other than the products known as motor spirit, petrol, kerosene or fuel oil.

4. Any person who acts in contravention of the provisions of clause 2 of this Order shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in Regulation 63 (1) of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (CYPRUS DEFENCE)  
REGULATIONS, 1939.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 52.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of Regulation 52 of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Lighting Restrictions) Order, 1939, and shall come into operation on and from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

2. All lights, whether public or private, in any town, village or place in the Colony which would be visible from the sea, shall be extinguished or adequately obscured in such manner as the Commissioner of the District may from time to time direct:

Provided that nothing in this Order contained shall apply to lights carried on motor cars or other vehicles travelling during the night, as long as such lights are not of greater brightness than is necessary for the public safety.

3. Any person acting in contravention of this Order or of any direction given by the Commissioner of the District as in clause 2 hereof provided shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in Regulation 63 (1) of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939.
