**THE EMERGENCY POWERS (CYPRUS DEFENCE)  
REGULATIONS, 1939.**

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER REGULATION 17.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by regulation 17 of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Restriction on use of Telephones) Order, 1939, and shall come into operation on and from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

2. In this Order—

“enemy subject” means—

- (a) an individual who possesses the nationality of a State at war with His Majesty, or
  - (b) a body of persons constituted or incorporated in, or under the Laws of, any such State.
3. The keeping of any telephone installation is hereby restricted to—
- (a) British subjects,
  - (b) British protected persons,
  - (c) aliens other than enemy subjects, and
  - (d) enemy subjects in respect of whom an order has not been made under the provisions of clause 4 hereof.

4.—(1) The Commissioner of Police may by an order in writing under his hand direct that any enemy subject specified in such order who is keeping a telephone installation on any premises occupied or used by him shall remove or cause to be removed such telephone installation therefrom within such time as may be specified in the order.

(2) Every such order shall be served upon the enemy subject named therein, and thereupon such enemy subject shall comply with the order within the time therein specified.

5. Any enemy subject who acts in contravention of or fails to comply with an order made under clause 4 hereof shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in regulation 63 (1) of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939.
