THE EMERGENCY POWERS (CYPRUS DEFENCE)
REGULATIONS, 1939.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 43.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of Regulation 43 of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Bread) Order, 1939, and shall come into operation on and from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*—
2. No person shall—
 - (a) sell or purchase, or
 - (b) offer for sale or attempt to sell or purchase, or
 - (c) either directly or indirectly make any arrangement for the sale of, any bread in any village in the Colony except in loaves weighing—
 - (i) One-half oke (200 drams), or
 - (ii) One oke (400 drams).

3. Any person who acts in contravention of the provisions of clause 2 of this Order shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in Regulation 63 (1) of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939.
