THE EMERGENCY POWERS (CYPRUS DEFENCE) *am. p. 606.* REGULATIONS, 1939.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 43.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of Regulation 43 of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939, I hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Drugs) Order, 1939.
2. For the purposes of this Order—

“drugs” means any drugs, proprietary medicines, chemical products, pharmaceutical preparations, sera and vaccines, and includes surgical supplies and hospital appliances ;

“registered importer” means a person registered under this Order as an importer of drugs ;

“registered Chemist and Druggist” means any person registered as Chemist and Druggist under the provisions of the Pharmacy Laws, 1900 and 1926.
3. Within ten days of the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette*, every importer of drugs, whether registered or not, shall complete and deliver to the Director of Medical Services in duplicate a declaration in the form set forth in Schedule A hereto, in respect of all drugs of any description in his possession or under his control.
4. Any person who wishes to import drugs shall make application to the Director of Medical Services in the form set forth in Schedule B hereto for registration as an importer. The Director of Medical Services may thereupon register such person as a registered importer and give him a certificate accordingly.
5. After ten days from the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette*, no person other than a registered importer shall import any drugs.
6. After ten days from the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette*, no importer other than a registered importer shall dispose of any drugs in any way whatsoever.

7. Every registered importer shall, within twenty-four hours of taking delivery of any drugs, complete and deliver to the Director of Medical Services a return in duplicate in the form set forth in Schedule C hereto, relating to such drugs.

8. No registered importer shall sell or otherwise dispose of any drugs except to a registered Chemist and Druggist: Provided that any registered importer may sell any of the drugs specified in Schedule D hereto to any person residing in and carrying on business in any village in which no registered Chemist and Druggist is carrying on business, for the purpose of resale to the public by such person.

9. No person other than a registered Chemist and Druggist shall sell drugs to the public: Provided that any person, residing in and carrying on business in any village in which no registered Chemist and Druggist is carrying on business, may sell to the public any of the drugs specified in Schedule D hereto. And provided further that any person other than a registered importer or a registered Chemist and Druggist who, on the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette*, holds stocks of any drugs may sell or otherwise dispose of such stocks to the public.

10. Any person who sells or exposes for sale or holds stocks of any drugs shall keep—

(a) a Register Book in respect of all such drugs in the form set forth in Schedule E hereto, the pages of which shall be of the size of thirteen inches by eight inches and shall be numbered consecutively; and

(b) a Sales Record Book in the form set forth in Schedule F hereto, the pages of which shall be of the size of thirteen inches by eight inches and shall be numbered consecutively; and

(c) a Receipt Book in the form set forth in Schedule G hereto, which shall consist of fifty white pages and fifty interleaved coloured pages, each page to be of the size of eight inches by five inches and each white page to be numbered consecutively and each such number to appear on the corresponding interleaved coloured page.

11. Every person selling drugs shall hand to the purchaser at the time of sale of such drugs a receipt from the Receipt Book prescribed in clause 10 (c) of this Order.

12. Within ten days of the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette*, every person who, on the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette*, has in his possession or under his control stocks of any drugs for sale to the public shall complete and deliver to the Director of Medical Services in duplicate a declaration in the form set forth in Schedule H hereto in respect of all drugs of any description in his possession or under his control.

13. Every person who sells or exposes for sale or holds stocks of any drugs shall permit such person as I, or the Director of Medical Services, may authorize by writing in that behalf to enter upon his premises and make such enquiries or inspection of his books or premises as may be necessary to ascertain the quantities of drugs in his possession or under his control or to check the correctness or accuracy of any declaration or return made by any such person under this Order.

14. Any person who—

(a) acts in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order, or

(b) makes a false declaration or return under clause 3 or 7 or 12 of this Order,

shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in Regulation 63 (1) of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939.

**THE EMERGENCY POWERS (CYPRUS DEFENCE)
REGULATIONS, 1939.**

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 43.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of Regulation 43 of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Regulation of Sale Prices) (Wheat) Amendment (No. 2) Order, 1939, and shall be read as one with the Defence (Regulation of Sale Prices) (Wheat) Orders, 1939, (hereinafter called "the Principal Order"), and the Principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Defence (Regulation of Sale Prices) (Wheat) Orders, 1939 to (No. 2) 1939.

2. The Schedule to the Principal Order is hereby repealed and the following Schedule substituted therefor:—
