

- (5) No signals shall be made from any aircraft except those essential for navigation ;
- (6) No aircraft shall fly which does not carry documents containing particulars of—
- (a) the nationality of each member of the crew and of each passenger, and
 - (b) the immediate and ultimate destination of each passenger, and
 - (c) the conditions under which cargo carried in the aircraft is being transported including the name and address of its consignor and its immediate and ultimate destination ;
- (7) No aircraft shall fly in such a manner as to be likely to endanger, or to interfere with, any of His Majesty's Forces, ships or aircraft ;
- (8) No aircraft shall fly without displaying the nationality, registration or other marks prescribed for such aircraft by or under any convention, rule or order for the time being in force, or with false marks, and no device shall be employed deliberately to obscure the marks of any aircraft.

3. Any person who acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable, on conviction, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine. No. 357. THE POST OFFICE LAWS, 1881 TO 1933.

DIRECTION UNDER SECTION 10.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 10 of the Post Office Laws, 1881 to 1933, His Excellency the Governor, upon the representation of the Postmaster-General, has been pleased to direct and it is hereby directed that as from the 15th day of December, 1939, there shall be established in the town of Famagusta a House-to-House Delivery Service for the delivery of all postal packets (other than postal packets chargeable with Customs duties).

2. This Direction shall be read in conjunction with the Post Office (Rates of Postage and Postal Charges) Order, 1934.
