THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO (No. 2) 1938.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1896

MADE UNDER SECTION 59.

W. D. BATTERSHILL,
Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 59 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 2) 1938, His Excellency the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Exportation of Goods (Declaration of Ultimate Destination) Order, 1939.

2. From and after the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette*, every exporter of goods to be exported from the Colony shall, prior to the exportation of such goods, furnish the Proper Officer of

Customs at the port of exportation or, if the goods are to be transmitted by post, the Postmaster at the office of posting, with a declaration of ultimate destination in the form set out in the Schedule hereto.

3. The Comptroller of Customs and Inland Revenue or the Postmaster-General, as the case may be, may at his discretion require an exporter to furnish security in the shape of a deposit or bond to an amount not exceeding double the value of the goods pending the production by such exporter of a certificate from the Customs Authorities at the port or place of ultimate destination proving that the goods so exported have arrived at such destination.

4. The provisions of this Order shall not apply to the exportation of goods consigned through the Postal Service where the total value of such goods does not exceed five pounds and such goods are exported to a private individual for his personal use.

5. The Exportation of Goods (Restriction) Order, 1939, is hereby repealed without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.
