THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO 1939.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1898

MADE UNDER SECTION 52.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1939, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Importation of Certain Goods (Restriction) Order, 1939.

2. From and after the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette*, the importation into the Colony of the goods set out in the Schedule hereto not being consigned from and grown, produced or manufactured in the British Empire (other than Canada and Newfoundland) is prohibited save under the authority of a licence granted by the Registrar of Co-operative Societies and subject to such terms and conditions as may be prescribed in such licence :

Provided that nothing in this Order contained shall apply to any goods proved to the satisfaction of the Comptroller of Customs and Inland Revenue to have been shipped to Cyprus prior to the date of the commencement of this Order.

**THE EMERGENCY POWERS (CYPRUS DEFENCE)
REGULATIONS, 1939.**

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 43.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of Regulation 43 of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939, I hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Foodstuffs from the United Kingdom) (Returns) Order, 1939.

2. In this Order—

“ foodstuffs ” includes every article used for food or drink by man, other than drugs or water and any article which ordinarily enters into or is used in the composition or preparation of human food or flavouring matters or condiments.

3. Every person who intends to import any description of foodstuffs from the United Kingdom shall, before transmitting an order for this purpose either by post or telegraph, furnish me with a return containing a full description of the nature and quantity of the foodstuffs the subject of his order together with the name of the person or firm in the United Kingdom by or through whom the foodstuffs are to be supplied
