In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 2) 1938, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs (Prohibition and Restriction of Imports) Amendment Order, 1939, and shall be read as one with the Customs (Prohibition and Restriction of Imports) Orders, 1936 and 1938, (hereinafter called "the Principal Order"), and the Principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Customs (Prohibition and Restriction of Imports) Orders, 1936 to 1939.

2. The First Schedule to the Principal Order is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of paragraph 9 and the substitution therefor of the following paragraph :—

45/115. "9. Articles, trinkets or ornaments which resemble any coins in current use in the Colony or in any other country and any goods or articles bearing any impression, representation or design in imitation of any currency note, bank note or coin in current use in the Colony or in any other country."
