THE BURIALS LAWS, 1896 AND 1937.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 1.

H. R. PALMER,

Governor.

Whereas the burial-ground situated in the village of Phlasou, in the District of Nicosia, at present used as a common burial-ground by the Moslem Community of the villages of Linou, Pano and Kato Phlasou and Ayios Epiphanios (Soleas) is dangerous to the health of the said village of Phlasou:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 1 of the Burials Laws, 1896 and 1937, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to order and hereby orders that a new common burial-ground shall be provided for the use of the Moslem Community of the villages of Linou, Pano and Kato Phlasou, and a new separate burial-ground for the use of the Moslem Community of the village of Ayios Epiphanios (Soleas), under the provisions of the said Laws.

The Order published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 19th August, 1938, under Notification No. 158, is hereby cancelled.
