NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 4.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 4 of the Quarantine Law, 1932, or otherwise, His Excellency the Governor is pleased to declare and it is hereby declared that the local areas in the first column of the Schedule hereto are infected local areas and that all passengers and goods therefrom shall, as from the date hereof, be subject to the measures prescribed by the Quarantine Regulations, 1932 to 1936, with respect to the dangerous infectious diseases in the second column of the Schedule hereto.

The Notification No. 64, published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of the 24th March, 1939, is hereby cancelled.

No. 74. The Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1938.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF NICOSIA.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1938, and otherwise, the Council of the Municipal Corporation

of Nicosia hereby make the following Bye-laws.

1. These Bye-laws may be cited as the Nicosia Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1939, and shall be read as one with the Nicosia Municipal (Principal and Amended Bye-laws), 1938 (hereinafter called "the Principal Bye-laws"), and the Principal Bye-laws and these Bye-laws may together be cited as the Nicosia Municipal Bye-laws, 1938 to 1939.

2. Bye-law 53 of the Principal Bye-laws is hereby amended as follows :-

The word "five" in line 1 shall be replaced by the word "three".

3. The following Bye-law shall be inserted in the Principal Bye-laws immediately after bye-law 53:-

"53A. No person shall keep-more than one ox or one cow without a written licence from the Council; the offspring of the ox or cow shall not count if under six months of age."
