(3) Convicted prisoners to whom paragraph (1) applies may be allowed to purchase weekly through the Prison Authority appointed for this purpose by the Inspector of Prisons cigarettes not exceeding twenty in number for their own use to the value of fifty per cent of their weekly earnings, the cost of such cigarettes being debited against the prisoner's earnings.

(4) Notwithstanding anything contained in regulation 183, convicted prisoners to whom paragraph (1) applies may be permitted to smoke at the morning exercise parade at the commencement of the day, after the midday meal and after the sounding of the cease labour bell, but no smoking shall be permitted during labour hours or at any time in cells or workshops.

(5) The Inspector of Prisons or the Governor of any Prison shall have power to stop any allowance or supply of eigarettes to any prisoner undergoing punishment for any offence against these regulations, or whose work or conduct is unsatisfactory, for such period as he may consider fit.

(6) Notwithstanding anything contained in this regulation, any child or young person within the meaning of the Juvenile Offenders Law, 1935, who was sent to the Government Stock Farm at Athalassa by any court under the provisions of the said Law prior to the 1st day of January, 1939, and any juvenile adult prisoner being over sixteen and under twenty-one years of age who was detailed for labour at the said Stock Farm prior to the said date may continue to be credited with an allowance at the rate of two piastres per day until such child, young person or juvenile adult prisoner as aforesaid is released or returned to the Central Prison as the case may be."

3. These regulations shall be deemed to have commenced and come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1939.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 4.

Whereas it has been represented to me that it is desirable in the public interest to erect new Government Offices at the village of Morphou, in the District of Nicosia :

Now, therefore, I, Herbert Richmond Palmer, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus, by virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 2, 3 and 4 of the Land Acquisition Laws, 1899 to 1936, do hereby declare the acquisition of land at the village of

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Morphou, in the District of Nicosia, and the erection thereon of new Government Offices to be an undertaking of public utility, and do hereby authorize the carrying out of the said undertaking, and do hereby entrust to the Director of Public Works the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking.

Whereas His Excellency the Governor is satisfied that in order to preserve the amenities of the ancient monument set out as item 11 in the Nicosia District, in the Second Schedule of the Antiquities Law, 1935, it is desirable that no building should be erected in the proximity of such ancient monument upon the plot of land described in the Schedule hereto and that any buildings thereon should be demolished:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the power vested in him by section 12 of the Antiquities Law, 1935, His Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct and hereby directs that the plot of land and the buildings described in the Schedule hereto be acquired on payment of such amount by way of compensation as may be agreed upon between the Commissioner of Nicosia and the proprietors of the said plot of land and the buildings and that in default of agreement within one month from the date hereof the amount of compensation be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition Laws, 1899 to 1936.
