ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1935

MADE UNDER SECTION 52.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1939, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Importation of Goods (Certificates of Origin and Interest) Amendment Order, 1940, and shall be read as one with the Importation of Goods (Certificates of Origin and Interest) Order, 1940, (hereinafter called "the Principal Order"), and the Principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Importation of Goods (Certificates of Origin and Interest) Orders, 1940.

2. The Principal Order is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following clause, immediately after clause 4:-

"4A. Notwithstanding anything in this Order contained, the Comptroller of Customs and Inland Revenue may allow delivery of any goods to which this Order relates:

(a) if satisfied that the certificate of origin and interest in respect of such goods has been detained by the proper authorities; or

(b) if such goods are accompanied, in lieu of a certificate of origin and interest, by a Customs Clearance Document evidencing

that the goods described therein have been examined in the United Kingdom for enemy exports, or by other official documentary evidence proving to the satisfaction of the Comptroller of Customs and Inland Revenue that the goods are not of enemy origin."
