THE ELEMENTARY EDUCATION LAWS, 1933 TO (No. 2) 1937.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 52.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 52 of the Elementary Education Laws, 1933 to (No. 2) 1937, His Excellency the Governor, on the report of the Director of Education, is pleased to order and hereby orders that the Town Committee and Village Commissions for Moslem Schools in the town and villages mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall in such town and villages respectively provide, erect, repair, extend, improve or develop any school buildings, premises, play grounds, yards, gardens or teachers' dwellings, as the case may be, particulars whereof are given in the second column of the said Schedule.

Phasoula (village) ..	Repairs to school building and teacher's dwelling.

THE PRISON DISCIPLINE LAW, 1879.

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 2.

Notice is hereby given that, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 2 of the Prison Discipline Law, 1879, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to approve that the Isolation Block in the Central Prison should be set apart as a prison as from the 27th February, 1940, for the detention of female prisoners, in lieu of that prescribed in Notification No. 294 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 13th October, 1939, which is hereby revoked.
