

No. 119. THE BURIALS LAWS, 1896 AND 1937.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 1.

W. D. BATTERSHILL,

Whereas the burial-ground situated in the village of Erimi, District of Limassol, now in use by the Orthodox-Christian Community for the burial of the dead, is dangerous to the health of the said village :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 1 of the Burials Laws, 1896 and 1937, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to order and hereby orders that a new burial-ground, in substitution for the burial-ground now in use as aforesaid, shall be provided under the provisions of the said Laws.

No. 120. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO 1939.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 66.

It is hereby notified that by virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by section 66 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1939, and duly deputed to me, I hereby approve the premises described in the third column of the Schedule hereto, belonging to the person whose name is set out in the first column of that Schedule and occupied by the person whose name is set out in the second column of that Schedule, to be a private warehouse for the warehousing of the goods specified in the fourth column of the said Schedule without payment of import duties upon the first entry of such goods therein.
