## THE EMERGENCY POWERS (CYPRUS DEFENCE) REGULATIONS, 1939.

Order made by the Competent Authority under Regulation 43.

In exercise of the powers vested in the by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of Regulation 43 of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939, I hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Regulation of Sale Prices) (Edible Coconut Oil) Order, 1940, and shall come into operation on and from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

2. No person shall—

(a) sell or purchase by retail, or

(b) offer for sale or attempt to sell or purchase by retail, or

(c) either directly or indirectly make any arrangement for the sale or purchase by retail of,

any edible coconut oil in any of the towns or villages in the Colony at a price in excess of the retail price shown in the first column of the Schedule hereto.

3. No person shall—

- (a) sell or purchase by wholesald, or
- (b) offer for sale or attempt to sell or purchase by wholesale, or
- (c) either directly or indirectly make any arrangement for the sale or purchase by wholesale of,

any edible coconut oil in any of the towns or villages in the Colony at a price in excess of the wholesale price shown in the second column of the Schedule hereto.

4. The Commissioner of each District shall, if so required by me, appoint Inspectors to enquire into the stocks of edible coconut oil which are in the possession or control of any person or generally of all persons residing in any town or village within his District.

5. Any person when so required to do by an Inspector appointed under clause 4 of this Order shall make a declaration of the stock of edible coconut oil in his possession or control and any such Inspector may enter upon any premises for the purpose of carrying out any inspection or search reasonably required in order to obtain the necessary information concerning the amount or condition of the stock of any such oil.

6. Where any person who sells or exposes for sale by retail or by wholesale or holds stocks of any edible coconut oil refuses, on demand being made to him by a prospective purchaser, to sell to him any such oil and such refusal is in my opinion, or in the opinion of the Commissioner of the District, unreasonable, such person shall at my request, or at the request of such Commissioner, deliver such oil to me or to him to be sold at a price in accordance with the provisions of clause 2 or 3 of this Order, as the case may be, or to be disposed of in such manner as I or the said Commissioner may in that behalf direct.

7. Every person selling edible coconut oil whether by retail or by wholesale shall keep on his premises a register showing the name of each purchaser of edible coconut oil and the quantity thereof purchased by each such purchaser.

8. No person shall sell by retail to any purchaser of edible coconut oil more than one week's supply during any one week.

9. For the purposes of this Order, the term "by wholesale" means— (a) any sale or purchase of, or

(b) any offer for sale of, or

(c) any attempt to sell or purchase, or

(d) any arrangement made, either directly or indirectly, for the sale or purchase of,

any edible coconut oil in quantities in excess of ten okes at any one time or at any single transaction.

10. Any person who—

(a) acts in contravention of the provisions of clause 2 or 3 or 5 or 6 or 7 or 8 of this Order, or

(b) makes a false declaration under clause 5 of this Order,

shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in Regulation 63 (1) of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939.

11. The Defence (Regulation of Sale Prices) (Vegetaline) Order, 1939, is hereby repealed, without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.

## The Quarantine Law, 1932.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 4.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 4 of the Quarantine Law, 1932, or otherwise, His Excellency the Governor is pleased to declare and it is hereby declared that the local areas in the first column of the Schedule hereto are infected local areas and that all passengers and goods therefrom shall, as from the date hereof, be subject to the measures prescribed by the Quarantine Regulations, 1932 to 1936, with respect to the dangerous infectious diseases in the second column of the Schedule hereto.

The Notification No. 423, published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 27th December, 1939, is hereby cancelled.
