THE EMERGENCY POWERS (CYPRUS DEFENCE)
REGULATIONS, 1939 TO 1940.

A. 42/194

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 43.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the purposes of Regulation 43 of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939 to 1940, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Drugs) Order, 1940, and shall come into operation on and from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

(1) The term “ Director ” means the Director of Medical Services.

(2) The term “ drugs ” means any drugs, proprietary medicines, chemical products, pharmaceutical preparations, sera and vaccines, and includes surgical supplies and hospital appliances.

(3) The term “ registered chemist and druggist ” means any person registered as chemist and druggist under the provisions of the Pharmacy Laws, 1900 and 1926.

(4) The term “ registered importer ” means any person registered under the provisions of this Order as an importer of drugs and includes any person who has been registered as an importer of drugs under the provisions of the Defence (Drugs) Orders, 1939.

(5) The term “ registered medical practitioner ” means any person registered as a medical practitioner under the provisions of the Medical Registration Laws, 1936 and 1939.

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3.—(1) Any person who wishes to import drugs shall make application to the Director in the form set forth in the First Schedule hereto for registration as an importer of drugs.

(2) Upon receipt of an application as in sub-clause (1) of this clause provided, the Director may register the applicant as an importer of drugs and issue to him a certificate of registration under his hand.

4. No person other than a registered importer shall import any drugs.

5. Every registered importer shall, within three days of taking delivery of any drugs, complete and deliver to the Director a return in duplicate in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, relating to such drugs.

6. No registered importer shall sell or otherwise dispose of any drugs except to a registered chemist and druggist or to a registered medical practitioner who is practising his profession in any village in which no registered chemist and druggist is carrying on business :

Provided that any registered importer may sell any of the drugs specified in the Third Schedule hereto, or any other drugs approved from time to time by the Director in writing, to any person residing in any village in which no registered chemist and druggist is carrying on business, for the purpose of resale by such person of such drugs to the public.

7. No person, other than a registered chemist and druggist or a registered medical practitioner who is practising his profession in any village in which no registered chemist and druggist is carrying on business, shall sell any drugs to the public :

Provided that any person, residing in any village in which no registered chemist and druggist is carrying on business, may sell to the public any of the drugs specified in the Third Schedule hereto, or any other drugs approved from time to time by the Director in writing, where such drugs have been sold to such person under the proviso to clause 6 of this Order :

Provided further that any person who, on the date of the coming into operation of this Order, holds stocks of any drugs may sell or otherwise dispose of such stocks to the public.

8.—(1) Every person who is—

- (a) a registered importer, or
- (b) a registered chemist and druggist, or
- (c) a registered medical practitioner who is practising his profession in any village in which no registered chemist and druggist is carrying on business,

and who sells or exposes for sale or holds stocks of any drugs shall keep—

- (i) a Register Book in respect of all such drugs in the form set forth in the Fourth Schedule hereto, the pages of which shall be of the size of thirteen inches by eight inches and shall be numbered consecutively ; and
- (ii) a Sales Record Book in the form set forth in the Fifth Schedule hereto, the pages of which shall be of the size of thirteen inches by eight inches and shall be numbered consecutively ; and
- (iii) a Daily Issues Book in the form set forth in the Sixth Schedule hereto or in loose leaflets in such form as may be approved from time to time by the Director in writing ; and
- (iv) Vouchers, numbered consecutively and showing the quantity of the drug, the cost price thereof, the date of the purchase thereof and the address and signature of the seller, for the purpose of verifying any entries relating to the receipt of such drug and made in the Register Book prescribed in paragraph (i) of this sub-clause.

(2) Every person, other than the persons to whom sub-clause (1) of this clause applies, who sells or exposes for sale or holds stocks of any drugs shall keep only the Sales Record Book prescribed in paragraph (ii) of sub-clause (1) of this clause.

9. Every person selling drugs shall date, sign and give to the purchaser at the time of the sale of such drugs a receipt numbered consecutively and showing the full name and address of the purchaser, the name and quantity of the drugs sold and the amount of the sale price and containing, in respect of such drugs, a reference to the number which appears in the Sales Record Book prescribed in clause 8 (1) (ii) of this Order or the number of the prescription under which the drugs have been dispensed :

Provided that, where the sale price of such drugs is eighteen piastres or less than eighteen piastres, no such receipt shall be given except where the purchaser demands such receipt.

10. Every person who sells or exposes for sale or holds stocks of any drugs shall permit such person as I, or the Director, may authorize by

writing in that behalf to enter upon his premises and make such enquiries or inspection of his books or premises as may be necessary—

- (a) to ascertain the quantities of drugs in his possession or under his control, or
- (b) to check the correctness or accuracy of any return made by such person under clause 5 of this Order, or
- (c) to ascertain whether the provisions of this Order have been or are being complied with.

11. Nothing in this Order contained—

(1) shall apply or shall be construed as applying to—

- (a) samples or any proprietary drugs where such samples are issued free of charge, or
- (b) any dental preparations where such dental preparations are to be used in dental mechanics, or
- (c) the sale of any of the drugs specified in the Seventh Schedule hereto, or of any other drugs approved from time to time by the Director in writing, where in either of the said cases such drugs are to be utilized—
 - (i) in any process or manufacture necessary to the carrying on of any trade or craft or business, or
 - (ii) in any laboratory, or
 - (iii) for any domestic purpose: Provided that where a person has in his possession or under his control any such drugs in quantities which are, in the opinion of the Director, unreasonable for such domestic purpose, such person shall, at the request of the Director in writing, dispose of such drugs, or such part thereof as may be specified in such request, within such time as may be specified in the request; or

(2) shall affect or shall be construed as affecting any of the provisions of the Laws, Regulations, Orders in Council and Notices enumerated in the Eighth Schedule hereto.

12. Any person who—

- (a) acts in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order, or
- (b) fails to comply with any request made under this Order, or
- (c) makes, under clause 5 of this Order, a return which is false in any material particular,

shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in Regulation 63 (1) of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939 to 1940.

13. The Defence (Drugs) Orders, 1939, are hereby repealed without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.
