### No. 216. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940.

#### ORDER UNDER REGULATION 2.

#### W. D. BATTERSHILL,

Governor.

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by Regulation 2 of the Defence Regulations, 1940, do hereby order as follows :---

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Essential Services) Order, 1940, and shall come into operation on and from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

2. The following services are declared to be of public utility or to be essential for the prosecution of the war or essential to the life of the community, that is to say—

- (a) all telephone, telegraph, submarine cable and wireless services;
- (b) all undertakings concerned in the production or supply of electrical energy;

(c) all undertakings concerned in the supply of water.

Made at Nicosia, this 7th day of June, 1940.

#### No. 217. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940.

Order under Regulation 75(1)(d).

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by Regulation 75 (1) (d) of the Defence Regulations, 1940, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Sound Signals Prohibition) Order, 1940, and shall come into operation on and from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

2. The sounding of sirens, hooters or any form of sound signal within the municipal limits of any town or village is hereby prohibited :

Provided that this Order shall not apply to sound signals used by motor vehicles.

3. Any person acting in contravention of this Order shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in Regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940.
