

4. If I fail to observe the terms of this declaration I shall pay to the Comptroller the full import duty for the time being in force for any such sheets without prejudice to any other proceedings which may be taken against me.

5. I agree that the Comptroller or any person authorized by him in that behalf shall at all times have the power and right to enter any premises wherein any such sheets as aforesaid are stored or kept for the purpose of ensuring that the terms of this declaration are complied with.

No. 227. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO 1940.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1954

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1940, and of every other power hereunto enabling, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Importation of Certain Goods (Restriction) Consolidation (Amendment) Order, 1940, and shall be read as one with the Importation of Certain Goods (Restriction) Consolidation Order, 1940, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Importation of Certain Goods (Restriction) Consolidation Orders, 1940.

2. The Schedule to the principal Order is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following item:—

" 95. Foodstuffs not otherwise specified."

No. 228. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO 1940.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1955

MADE UNDER SECTION 52.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1940, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Importation of Foodstuffs from the United Kingdom (Restriction) Order, 1940.

2. In this Order—

" Food Controller " means the Registrar of Co-operative Societies, Nicosia ;

“ Foodstuffs ” means every article used for food or drink by man, other than drugs or water, and any article which ordinarily enters into or is used in the composition or preparation of human food, or flavouring matters or condiments, and includes tobacco and cigarettes.

3. The importation into the Colony of foodstuffs consigned from the United Kingdom is hereby prohibited save under the written authority of the Food Controller.

4. Any person intending to import any description of foodstuffs from the United Kingdom shall before transmitting an order for this purpose either by post or telegraph, send or produce the order in triplicate to the Food Controller for examination and endorsement by him or by such person as may be authorized by him in that behalf and shall answer all questions put to him by the Food Controller or other authorized person concerning the order and the purposes for which the foodstuffs the subject of the order are required.

No. 229. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940.

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 75.

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by Regulation 75 of the Defence Regulations, 1940, do hereby make the following order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Loud Speakers Restriction) Order, 1940, and shall come into operation on and from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

2. In this Order—

“ loud speaker ” means the loud speaker of a wireless set or wireless apparatus and any loud speaker used or operated in conjunction with a wireless set, wireless apparatus, gramophone or any sound-producing apparatus.

3. No person shall—

(a) use or operate any loud speaker ;

(b) cause any music, tune or sound of any description whatsoever to be produced, reproduced, amplified or transmitted by or through a loud speaker,

if by such use, operation, production, reproduction, amplification or transmission the tune or sound emanating from such loud speaker can be heard outside the place or premises in which such loud speaker is installed :

Provided that nothing in this Order shall apply to the sound effects of a cinematograph film exhibited in any place or premises duly licensed for the purpose, so long as the cinematograph apparatus or loud speaker is tuned down to the quietest point which would enable the audience to follow the programme and so long as no other sound effects except the effects immediately connected with the actual exhibition of the cinematograph film are produced, reproduced, transmitted or amplified during such exhibition.
