THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER REGULATION 55.

W. D. BATTERSHILL,

Governor.

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by Regulation 55 of the Defence Regulations, 1940, do hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Use of Vehicles) Order, 1940, and shall come into operation on the 22nd of June, 1940.
 - 2. In this Order—
 - "the hours of darkness" means the interval between half an hour after sunset and half an hour before sunrise.
- 3. During the hours of darkness no person shall, without the permission in writing of the Commissioner of the District, use any motor vehicle on any road outside the municipal limits of any town:

Provided that nothing in this Order shall apply to any member of His Majesty's Forces or of the Cyprus Police Force or any Commissioner acting in the course of his duty as such.

4. Any person who acts in contravention of this Order shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in Regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940.

THE ADVOCATES LAWS, 1933 TO 1940.
