No. 264. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of Regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Control of Sale Prices of Scheduled Articles) Consolidation Order, 1940.

2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

(1) The term "purchase" includes—

(a) any offer to purchase; and

(b) any attempt to purchase; and

(c) any arrangement to purchase made either directly or indirectly.

(2) The terms "sale" and "sell" include—

(a) any offer to sell; and

(b) any attempt to sell; and

(c) any arrangement to sell made either directly or indirectly.

(3) The term "scheduled article" means any of the articles specified in any of the Parts of the ~~First and Second Schedules~~ hereto.

(4) The terms "registered distributor" and "registered retailer" mean a distributor or a retailer, as the case may be, who is specified or is registered as such in, or in accordance with the provisions of, the Defence (Registration of Retailers of Specified Foodstuffs) Order, 1940.

3. Subject to such definitions, conditions, exceptions, limitations and modifications, if any, as are set out in any of the Parts of the ~~First and Second Schedules~~ hereto in respect of a scheduled article, no person shall sell or purchase any scheduled article in any town or village in the Colony at a price in excess of the price specified in that Part of the ~~First and Second Schedules~~ hereto which relates to such article: Provided that whenever the price for the whole quantity of such article involves the payment of a fraction of ten *paras*, there may be charged and paid therefor a sum of ten *paras*.

4. I may appoint Inspectors, and the Commissioner of each District shall, if so required by me, appoint Inspectors,—

(a) to enquire into the stocks of any scheduled article which are in the possession or under the control of any person or generally of all persons residing in any town or village in the Colony, and

(b) to ascertain whether the provisions of this Order are being complied with.

5. Every Inspector appointed under the provisions of clause 4 of this Order may require any person to make a declaration in writing—

(a) of the stock of any scheduled article in his possession or under his control, and

(b) of the place or places at which such scheduled article is stored or kept,

and thereupon such person shall make a declaration in writing accordingly.

6. Every person shall permit any Inspector appointed under the provisions of clause 4 of this Order to enter upon his premises for the purpose of carrying out any inspection or search reasonably required in order—

- (a) to obtain the necessary information concerning the amount or condition of any stock of any scheduled article, or
- (b) to check the correctness or accuracy of any declaration made under the provisions of clause 5 of this Order, or
- (c) to ascertain whether the provisions of this Order are being complied with.

7. At any inspection or search of premises made under the provisions, and for any of the purposes, of clause 6 of this Order, the owner or person in charge of such premises shall—

- (1) answer truly all questions put to him by the Inspector carrying out such inspection or search, and
- (2) produce for inspection to such Inspector all books and documents in his possession or under his control:

Obligation to answer questions and to produce books and documents for inspection.

Provided that the owner or person in charge of such premises shall not be compelled to answer any question—

- (a) which is not reasonably required for the purpose of such inspection or search, or
- (b) the answer to which would have a tendency to expose him to a criminal charge, or
- (c) the answer to which would be excluded on grounds of public policy or privilege if given before a Court of Law.

8. Where any person who—

- (a) carries on business in respect of any scheduled article shown in the First Schedule, or

Refusal to sell scheduled articles.

(b) holds a stock of any such article in excess of his reasonable domestic requirements for a period not exceeding one month, refuses, on demand being made to him by a prospective purchaser and on being offered the requisite purchase price, to sell to him such article and such refusal is in my opinion, or in the opinion of the Commissioner of the District, unreasonable, such person shall at my request, or at the request of the Commissioner of the District, deliver such article to me, or to the Commissioner of the District, to be sold at a price in accordance with the provisions of clause 3 of this Order or to be disposed of in such manner, as I, or the Commissioner of the District, may in that behalf direct.

9. Every person selling any scheduled article shall, if so required by the purchaser, supply such purchaser with a receipt showing the scheduled article sold, the price paid for such scheduled article and the date of sale, and bearing the signature of the vendor.

Receipts.

10. Every person who exposes for sale, or holds a stock of, any scheduled article shall exhibit and keep exhibited at a conspicuous place on his premises a list showing the maximum price at which each such scheduled article is offered for sale.

List of maximum prices.

11.—(1) Every person selling any scheduled article ~~shown in the First Schedule~~ by wholesale shall keep on his premises a register showing the name of each purchaser of such article, the quantity thereof purchased by each such purchaser and the price at which such article was sold.

12. Any person who—

- (a) acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Order, or

Penalties.

(b) makes any declaration under the provisions of clause 5 of this Order which is false in any material particular, shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in Regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940.

13. The ~~First and Second~~ Schedules hereto may be amended by me by Notice published in the *Gazette* and upon such publication such amendment shall form part of this Order for all purposes.

14. This Order, in so far as it relates to any scheduled article shown in the ~~Second~~ Schedule, shall be read in conjunction with the Defence (Registration of Retailers of Specified Foodstuffs) Order, 1940, and the Defence (Specified Foodstuffs) Registration of Householders Order, 1940.

15. This Order shall come into operation on and from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*, and thereupon the Defence (Control of Sale Prices of Scheduled Articles) Orders, 1940 to (No. 12) 1940, shall be repealed:

Provided that such repeal shall not affect—

- (a) the previous operation of any Order so repealed, or
- (b) anything duly done or suffered under any Order so repealed, or
- (c) any right, obligation or liability acquired, accrued or incurred under any Order so repealed, or
- (d) any penalty incurred in respect of any contravention of any Order so repealed, or
- (e) any investigation, legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any such right, obligation, liability or penalty as aforesaid;

And any such investigation, legal proceeding or remedy may be instituted or enforced, and any such penalty may be imposed, as if this Order had not been made.
