

No. 271. THE CUSTOMS (EXPORT DUTY) LAW, 1940.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1958

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 5 of the Customs (Export Duty) Law, 1940, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs (Export Duty) (Goods for Military Purposes) Order, 1940.

2. From and after the 18th day of July, 1940, all rates of export duty set forth in the Schedule to the Customs (Export Duty) Law, 1940, payable in respect of any of the goods therein specified, which are certified by an officer of His Majesty's Forces to be exported for military purposes, are cancelled.
