

**No. 334. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940.**

**ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.**

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of Regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940, I hereby order as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Utilization of Broken Carobs) Order, 1940.

Interpretation.

2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“ animal ” means any horse, mule, ass, cattle, sheep or goat.

“ broken carobs ” means carobs broken into small pieces, and includes kibbled carobs.

Carobs to be mixed with barley or oats when feeding animals.

3. From and after the 1st September, 1940, no person shall feed any animal with any barley or oats unless broken carobs are mixed with such barley or oats in a proportion of 20% by weight of the whole feed, exclusive of any straw, hay, silage or green forage: Provided that nothing in this Order contained shall apply to the owner of any sheep or goats if his flock is at pasture and is not being hand-fed.

Power to appoint inspectors.

4. I may appoint Inspectors and the Commissioner of each District shall, if so required by me, appoint inspectors, to ascertain whether the provisions of this Order have been, or are being, complied with and every inspector so appointed shall have power to enter at all times at all reasonable hours upon any premises for the purpose of carrying out any inspection or search which may be reasonably required in order to ascertain whether the provisions of this Order have been, or are being, complied with.

Penalties for breach of Order.

5. Any person who acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Order, is liable to the penalties prescribed in Regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940.
