THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION LAWS, 1930 TO 1938.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF FAMAGUSTA.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1938, and otherwise, the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Famagusta hereby make the following Bye-laws:

1. These Bye-laws may be cited as the Famagusta Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1940, and shall be read as one with the Famagusta Municipal Bye-laws, 1940, (hereinafter referred to as Gazette: "the principal Bye-laws") and the principal Bye-laws and these Byelaws may together be cited as the Famagusta Municipal (Principal and 7.2.1940) Amended) Bye-laws, 1940.

Supplement

2. Bye-law 209 (1) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the word "Tefkros" which occurs in line 3 in the paragraph dealing with "GENNADIUS STREET", and the substitution therefor of the word "Hermes".
