THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) LAW, 1880.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTIONS 1 AND 2 (1) (a), (b) AND (l).

In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by sections 1 and 2 (1) (a), (b) and (l) of the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Law, 1880, duly deputed to me under section 4 of the said Law by paragraph 3 of the Notification No. 527 published in the *Gazette* of the 3rd July, 1931, I, Robert Jestin Roe, Chief Veterinary Officer, hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Ox Warble-Fly Control (Rizokarpaso) Order, 1940.

2. In this Order—

“cattle” includes any bull, calf, cow, heifer or ox.

“infected place” means the place described in paragraph 3 of this Order.

3. That portion of the village area of Rizokarpaso lying north-east of the fence which runs from the sea at the locality “Galouni” to the sea on the north coast of the said area is hereby declared to be a place infected with animal disease, to wit: Ox Warble-Fly.

4. The moving of any cattle into the infected place, save under permit in writing from me, is hereby prohibited.

5. Every person possessing cattle in the infected area shall, save under permit in writing from me, remove such cattle to a place outside the infected area on or before the 7th day of September, 1940.

6. Any cattle found in the infected area on or after the 8th day of September, 1940, and in respect of which no permit has been issued in accordance with paragraphs 4 and 5 of this Order, shall be slaughtered or otherwise disposed of as I shall direct.
