THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 2) 1940.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of Regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 2) 1940, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Returns of Stocks and Restriction of Sale of Newsprint) Order, 1940, and shall come into operation on the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

2. For the purposes of this Order—

“Dealer in newsprint” means any person who has in his possession or under his control any newsprint for the purposes of sale whether by retail or by wholesale;—

“Newspaper” has the same meaning as in the Newspapers, Books and Printing Presses Laws, 1934 to 1936;

“Newspaper proprietor” means any person holding a licence to publish a newspaper under the Newspapers, Books and Printing Presses Laws, 1934 to 1936;

“Newsprint” means any paper of a size suitable for use for printing newspapers.

3. Within 5 days of the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette*, every dealer in newsprint and every newspaper proprietor shall complete and deliver to the Public Information Officer at Nicosia a declaration in the form set forth in the Schedule hereto, containing the particulars therein mentioned, in respect of all newsprint which he holds in stock or in his possession or under his control, over and above 500 sheets.

4. Every person importing any newsprint after the completion and delivery of the declaration specified in Clause 3 of this Order shall, within twenty-four hours of taking delivery thereof, notify the Public Information Officer of the arrival and quantity and approximate size of sheet and value of each consignment of newsprint received by him and of the place where such newsprint is stored.

5. Every person to whom this Order applies shall permit such person as I may authorize by writing in that behalf to enter upon his premises and make such enquiries or inspection of his books, invoices, accounts, documents or premises as may be necessary to ascertain the quantities or condition of newsprint in his possession or under his control or to check the correctness or accuracy of any declaration made or of any notification given by such person under this Order.

6. On and from the date of the publication of this Order in the *Gazette* no dealer in newsprint and no newspaper proprietor shall sell or otherwise

dispose of any newsprint to any other person except under and in virtue of a special permit issued under the hand of the Public Information Officer:

Provided that nothing in this clause contained shall apply to any newsprint in the possession of a newspaper proprietor at the time of the coming into force of this Order used by him for the purpose of printing the newspaper of which he is the proprietor.

7. Every special permit issued under the provisions of Clause 6 of this Order may contain such terms and conditions (including the price at which the newsprint is to be sold or disposed) as may be specified therein.

8. Any dealer in newsprint or any newspaper proprietor who—

(a) acts in contravention of the provisions of this Order or of any of the terms and conditions specified in a special permit issued under this Order; or

(b) makes a false declaration under Clause 3 of this Order; or

(c) gives a false notification under Clause 4 of this Order,

is liable to the penalties prescribed in Regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 2) 1940.
