

No. 379. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of Regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Sugar for Manufacturing Purposes) Order, 1940.

2. For the purposes of this Order—

“Registered manufacturer” means a person who has been registered under this Order as a manufacturer of aerated waters, syrup, or confectionery.

3. Within one week from the date of the publication of this Order any person desiring to be registered under this Order as a registered manufacturer shall complete and deliver to the Commissioner of his district an application in the form containing the declaration and particulars set forth in the Schedule hereto, and if the application is granted, such person shall be registered as a registered manufacturer and thereupon the Commissioner of the District shall grant to such person a certificate of registration.

4. Any person who makes an application under Clause 3 of this Order which is false in any material particular is liable to the penalties prescribed in Regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940.

2. I/We declare that during the last 12 months my/our average monthly consumption of sugar for manufacturing purposes in my/our establishment was bags of approximately 78 okes each.

No. 380. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of Regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Registration of Bakers) Amendment Order, 1940, and shall be read as one with the Defence (Registration of Bakers) Order, 1940, hereinafter called the “principal Order”, and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Defence (Registration of Bakers) Orders, 1940.

2. Clause 5 (b) of the principal Order is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "and cooked potatoes".

3. Clause 6 of the principal Order is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "and not less than 10% and not more than 15% of cooked potatoes."

4. Clause 8 of the principal Order is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "and of potatoes" which occur in paragraphs (a) and (b) thereof.

THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF SALE PRICES OF SCHEDULED ARTICLES) CONSOLIDATION ORDER, 1940.

NOTICE NO. 8 UNDER CLAUSE 13.

A.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the addition to Part 2 of the following exception:—

"*Exception.*—Where sales of specially-selected barley suitable for brewing are made to brewers to whom a licence has been issued under my hand, the sale price may be 80 *paras* per oke."

B.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the addition to Part 6 of the following limitation:—

"*Limitation.*—No person who has in his possession or under his control more than one bag of coffee of approximately 48 okes shall refuse to sell by wholesale."

C.—The Schedule is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following part:—
