These Regulations may be cited as the Immigration (Registration of Aliens) Amendment Regulations, 1940 , and shall be read as one with the Immigration (Registration of Aliens) Regulations, 1939 and (No. 2) 1939, Gazettes: (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal No. 3: Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Immigration $\quad$ 3.3.1939 (Registration of Aliens) Regulations, 1939 to 1940.
2. Regulation 10 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following proviso :-
" Provided that the Governor may waive the payment of such fee if in any case he considers it desirable so to do."
3. These Regulations shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of September, 1940.
