No. 410. THE DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940 TO (No. 3) 1940.

ORDER MADE BY THE COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of Regulation 61 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 3) 1940, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Newsprint Control) Order, 1940, and shall come into operation on the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

2. For the purposes of this Order—

“newspaper” has the same meaning as in the Newspaper, Books and Printing Presses Laws, 1934 to 1936;

“newspaper proprietor” means any person holding a licence to publish a newspaper under the Newspaper, Books and Printing Presses Laws, 1934 to 1936;

“newsprint” means any white printing paper of a size suitable for use for printing a newspaper;

“unsold copies” means all copies of newspapers other than those distributed to subscribers or sold to the general public through a distributing agency or normally distributed free of charge to libraries, advertisers, staff, to other newspapers and to the Colonial Secretary.

3. Every person importing any newsprint shall, within twenty-four hours of taking delivery thereof notify me of the arrival of such newsprint and of the quantity and approximate size of the sheet and value of each consignment of newsprint received by him and of the place where such newsprint is stored.

4. No person shall use, cut, sell or otherwise dispose of in any manner whatsoever any newsprint in his possession or under his control except under and in virtue of a permit issued under my hand:

Provided that nothing in this clause contained shall apply to any newsprint which at the coming into force of this Order is in the possession of a newspaper proprietor and is used by him for the purpose of printing the newspaper of which he is the proprietor.

5. Every permit issued under the provisions of clause 4 of this Order may contain such terms and conditions (including the price at which such newsprint is to be sold or disposed) as may be specified therein.

6. Not later than twelve days after the last day of each month, every newspaper proprietor shall complete and deliver to me, at Nicosia, a separate return in the form set forth in the Schedule hereto containing the particulars therein mentioned in respect of his current stock of newsprint and of the consumption of newsprint for the printing of each and every newspaper of which he is the proprietor.

7. I may appoint Inspectors to ascertain whether the provisions of this Order are being complied with and every such Inspector shall have power to enter at all times and at all reasonable hours upon any premises for the purpose of carrying out any inspection or search (including inspection of books, invoices, accounts and other documents) as may be reasonably required in order to ascertain whether the provisions of this Order are being complied with.

8. Any person who—

(a) acts in contravention of the provisions of this Order or of any of the terms and conditions specified in any permit issued under this Order;

(b) gives under clause 3 of this Order a notification which is false;

(c) makes under clause 6 a return which is false in any material particular, is liable to the penalties prescribed in Regulation 94 of the Defence Regulations, 1940 to (No. 3) 1940.

9. The Defence (Returns of Stocks and Restriction of Sale of Newsprint) Orders, 1940, and the Defence (Control of Consumption of Newsprint) Order, 1940, are hereby revoked without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder, and sub-section (2) of section 11 of the Interpretation Law, 1935, shall apply to such revocation as it applies to the repeal by any law passed after the enactment of that Law or any other enactment.

"PART 26.—WHOLE WHEAT FLOUR.

2. In plain villages except in the villages of Lapithos, Karavas and Kazaphani	125 " "
3. In hill villages	135 " "
4. In all villages, when purchased in towns in quantities of not less than one bag of 50 okes in respect of which a receipt has been given by the municipal weigher of the Municipality where the purchase has been made	145 " "
5. In towns, when purchased in other towns in quantities of not less than one bag of 50 okes in respect of which a receipt has been given by the municipal weigher of the Municipality where the purchase has been made	145 " "

Definition.—'Whole wheat flour' shall have the same meaning as in the Defence (Sale of Barley Flour and Wheat Flour) Order, 1940.

Condition.—Any person selling at the prices shown under paragraphs 4 and 5 shall keep on his premises a register showing the quantity of each purchase, the date and the person from whom the flour was purchased."
