Possession in the exercise of the jurisdiction conferred by the said Act, whether original or appellate, may be made by the same authority and in the same manner as rules touching the practice, procedure, fees, and costs in the said court in the exercise of its ordinary civil jurisdiction respectively are made:

And whereas under the provisions of clauses 217 and 218 of the Cyprus Courts of Justice Orders and Laws, 1927 to (No. 2) 1935, the Governor, with the advice and assistance of the Chief Justice, is the authority for the purpose of making rules as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by clauses 217 and 218 of the Cyprus Courts of Justice Orders and Laws, 1927 to (No. 2) 1935, and with the advice and assistance of the Chief Justice, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make and hereby makes the following Rules and Order:—

- 1. These Rules and Order may be cited as the Cyprus Prize Court (Fees) Rules and Order, 1940.
- 2. The fees set out in Appendix B of the Schedule to the Order of His Majesty in Council, dated the second day of September, 1939, made under section 3 of the Prize Courts Act, 1894, (57 and 58 Vict. c. 39), in respect of the several matters therein mentioned are hereby fixed and appointed to be taken in the Prize Court of Cyprus and in any office which is connected with the said Prize Court and by any officer attached to the said Prize Court.
- 3. The fees set out in Appendix C of the Schedule to the Order of His Majesty in Council dated the second day of September, 1939, made under section 3 of the Prize Courts Act, 1894, (57 and 58 Vict. c. 39), in respect of the several matters therein mentioned are hereby fixed and appointed to be charged by and allowed to advocates in proceedings taken in the Prize Court of Cyprus.
