THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 1.

- I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 1 of the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, as extended to the Colony by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940, do hereby make the following Regulations:—
- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Defence (Suspension of certain Statutory Provisions) Regulations, 1940, and shall come into force on and from the 1st January, 1941.
- 2. The operation of the Laws set out in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall, during the continuance in force of these Regulations, be suspended to the extent specified in the second column of such Schedule.

The Quarantine Law, 1932.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 4.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 4 of the Quarantine Law, 1932, or otherwise, His Excellency the Governor is pleased to declare and it is hereby declared that the local areas in the first column of the Schedule hereto are infected local areas and that all passengers and goods therefrom shall, as from the date hereof, be subject to the measures prescribed by the Quarantine Regulations, 1932 to 1936, with respect to the dangerous infectious diseases in the second column of the Schedule hereto.

The Notification No. 254, published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of the 26th June, 1940, is hereby cancelled.
