## ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1921

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1939, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows :-

1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Raw Cotton) Exemption Order, 1940.

2. From and after the 14th February, 1940, up to and including the 30th June, 1940, raw cotton of a total quantity not exceeding 40,000 okes proved to the satisfaction of the Comptroller to be imported for industrial purposes by any owner of a Cotton Mill, shall be admitted into the Colony free from all import duties.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1922

MADE UNDER SECTION 59.

W. D. BATTERSHILL,

Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 59 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1939, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:----

1. This Order may be cited as the Exportation of Goods (Declaration of Ultimate Destination) Amendment Order, 1940, and shall be read as one with the Exportation of Goods (Declaration of Ultimate Destination) Order, 1939, (hereinafter called "the Principal Order"), and the Principal Gazette: Order and this Order may together be cited as the Exportation of Goods Supplement (Declaration of Ultimate Destination) Orders, 1939 and 1940.

No. 3: 6.12.1939

2. Clause 2 of the Principal Order is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following proviso :--

" Provided that where goods are to be exported from the Colony is to Egypt in transit the exporter may, in lieu of furnishing the Proper Officer of Customs at the Port of Exportation with a declaration of

ultimate destination, furnish such officer-

(a) with a declaration in such form and containing such particulars as may be prescribed by the Comptroller of Customs and Inland Revenue, and

(b) with security in the shape of a deposit or a bond to an amount not exceeding double the value of the goods pending the production by such exporter of a declaration of ultimate destination made by the exporter or vendor in Egypt of the goods and certified by the British Consular Officer in Egypt."
