In exercise of the powers dested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as the Competent Authority for the purposes of Regulation 43 of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939 464 √ 464 √ ^{the.} 4473,√ • 490.√ 547 √ to (No. 1) 1939, I hereby order as follows :---1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Control of Sale Prices Short title of Scheduled Articles) Order, 1940. Interpre-2. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires, tation. (1) The term "purchase" includes-(a) any offer to purchase; and (b) any attempt to purchase; and (c) any arrangement to nurchase made either directly or indirectly. (2) The terms "sale" and "sell" include-(a) any offer to sell; and (b) any attempt to sell; and (c) any arrangement to sell made either directly or indirectly.

(3) The term "scheduled article," means any of the articles

specified in any of the Parts of the First Schedule hereto.

3. Subject to such definitions, conditions, exceptions, limitations and Sale prices. modifications, if any, as are set out in any of the Parts of the First Schedule hereto in respect of a scheduled article, no person shall sell or purchase any scheduled article in any town or village in the Colony at a price in excess of the price specified in that Part of the First Schedule hereto which relates to such scheduled article.

4. I may appoint Inspectors, and the Commissioner of each District Power to shall, if so required by me, appoint Inspectors,-

- (a) to enquire into the stocks of any scheduled article which are for certain in the possession or under the control of any person or generally for certain of all persons residing in any town or village in the Colony, and
- (b) to ascertain whether the provisions of this Order have been or are being complied with.

Obligation to make declaration of stock of scheduled article, when so required by an Inspector. Power to Inspector to enter upon, and inspect,

premises for certain purposes.

Obligation to answer questions and to produce books and documents for inspection.

Provisions applicable to refusal to sell scheduled articles.

5. Every Inspector appointed under the provisions of clause 4 of this Order may require any person to make a declaration in writing-

(a) of the stock of any scheduled article in his possession or under his control, and

(b) of the place or places at which such scheduled article is stored or kept,

and thereupon such person shall make a declaration in writing accordingly.

6. Every person shall permit any Inspector appointed under the provisions of clause 4 of this Order to enter upon his premises for the purpose of carrying out any inspection or search reasonably required in order-

(a) to obtain the necessary information concerning the amount or condition of any stock of any scheduled article, or

(b) to check the correctness or accuracy of any declaration made under the provisions of clause 5 of this Order, or

(c) to ascertain whether the provisions of this Order have been or are being complied with.

7. At any inspection or search of premises made under the provisions, and for any of the purposes, of clause 6 of this Order, the owner or person in charge of such premises shall-

(1) answer truly all questions put to him by the Inspector carrying out such inspection or search, and

(2) produce for inspection to such Inspector all books and documents in his possession or under his control:

Provided that the owner or person in charge of such premises shall not be compelled to answer any question-

- (a) which is not reasonably required for the purpose of such inspection or search, or
- (b) the answer to which would have a tendency to expose him to a criminal charge, or
- (c) the answer to which would be excluded on grounds of public policy or privilege if given before a Court of Law.

8. Where any person who—

(a) carries on business in respect of any scheduled article, or

(b) holds a stock of any scheduled article in excess of his reasonable domestic requirements for a period not exceeding one month,

refuses, on demand being made to him by a prospective purchaser and on being offered the requisite purchase price, to sell to him such scheduled article and such refusal is in my opinion, or in the opinion of the Commissioner of the District, unreasonable, such person shall at my request, or at the request of the Commissioner of the District, deliver such scheduled article to me, or to the Commissioner of the District, to be sold at a price in accordance with the provisions of clause 3 of this Order or to be disposed of in such manner, as I, or the Commissioner of the District, may in that behalf direct.

9. Every person selling any scheduled article shall, if so required by the purchaser, supply such purchaser with a receipt showing the scheduled article sold, the price paid for such scheduled article and the date of sale, with receipt, and bearing the signature of the vendor.

> 10. Every person who exposes for sale, \or holds a stock of, any scheduled article shall exhibit and keep exhibited at a conspicuous place on his premises a list showing the maximum price at which each such scheduled article is offered for sale.

11.-(1) Every person selling any scheduled article by wholesale Obligation shall keep on his premises a register showing the name of each purchaser to keep of such scheduled article, the quantity thereof purchased by each such register in respect of purchaser and the price at which such scheduled article was sold.

(2) In this clause-

the term "wholesale" means a sale of a scheduled article in quantities of not less than, or in excess of, the quantities prescribed in that Part of the First Schedule hereto which relates to such scheduled article.

12. Any person who-

(a) acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Order, or

(b) makes, under clause 5 of this Order, a declaration in writing which is false in any material particular,

shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in Regulation 63 (1) of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) Regulations, 1939 to (No. 1) 1939.

13. This Order shall come into operation on and from the date of its Date of publication in the Gazette, and thereupon the Orders specified in the coming into Second Schedule hereto shall be repealed :

Provided that such repeal shall not affect

(a) the previous operation of any Order to repealed, or

- (b) anything duly done or suffered under any Order so repealed, or
- (c) any right, obligation or liability acquired, accrued or incurred under any Order so repealed, or
- (d) any penalty incurred in respect of any contravention of any Order so repealed, or
- (e) any investigation, legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any such right, obligation, liability or penalty as aforesaid;

And any such investigation, legal proceeding or remedy may be instituted or enforced, and any such penalty may be imposed, as if this Order had not been made.
