In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1939, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order and it is hereby ordered

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Mining Timber) Exemption Order, 1940.
 - 2. Sawn timber of any dimensions—
 - (i) imported into the Colony between the 14th day of February, 1940, and the 13th day of February, 1941, both days inclusive, and
 - (ii) proved to the satisfaction of the Comptroller to be solely required for use underground in the mines of the importer, and
 - (iii) proved to the satisfaction of the Comptroller to be of a quantity not exceeding the quantity imported for use underground in the mines of the importer between the 14th day of February, 1939, and the 13th day of February, 1940, both days inclusive,

shall be admitted into the Colony free from all import duties.
